

RHSV DISASTER RELIEF

Following the disastrous bushfires on Black Saturday, February 7th 2009, the RHSV set up a Disaster Relief Fund with an initial grant of \$10,000

With generous support from our members, affiliated clubs and member clubs of the Garden Clubs of Australia, the fund increased to nearly \$30,000. To date we have made Grants to some of the deserving recipients. The largest grant was \$3200 to purchase 10,000 daffodil bulbs. AUTUMN IN THE GARDEN

What a hot and dry summer we are having; I have had 20% to 30% of my white and red onions sunburnt. It is only a short period when the onions stops growing and dries off and is ready for storage.

It is a good time to get ready for the winter green vegetables. They need an open position with plenty of compost to achieve the best results.

I like to have cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, silver beet, swedes and turnips in the ground before the end of March so they can take advantage of the warm soil.

Keep the water up to the pumpkin patch as if the young fruits set by the end of February they will have time to mature before the cooler weather arrives.

Broad beans and peas are better sown in April and May for the best results.
