#### NOW WELL INTO AUTUMN

Autumn has its own smells –

There's the smell of wet earth, the last sniff of roses and gardenias, once the haunting smell of burning leaves but nowadays we are not permitted to burn leaves, we shred or compost them. The fallen leaves can be the gardener's worry or blessing according to an attitude of mind.

Wise gardeners lust after them if having none of their own will travel to neighbourhood streets in pursuit of free bounty.

Layers of leaves, especially Oak leaves are a must for the compost bin but should you be considering using them as mulch to retain moisture and reduce weeds, they are best shredded. A layer of solid leaves can make it tough going for plants trying to push their way to the light. You can run the lawn mower over them until they are of a consistency fine enough to be run through your fingers.

I have a 3 in 1 blower which blows the leaves into a corner and mulches them.

### **MAY IN THE GARDEN**

I find May is one of the busiest times in the garden and my energy returns after the heat of summer. Most summer crops are finished and need renewal by the winter crops. It is a good idea to use some liquid manure on the brassicas every week to keep growth moving along before the really cold weather sets in. If the white butterfly is around a dusting or spray may be needed if any caterpillars are present. Usually by mid May these butterflies have disappeared and do not return till August or September.

About the only seeds to sow now are broad beans and peas while the last of the Spring bulbs should be in the ground by the end of the month. If spring flowers are required seedlings of your favourites should also be in the moist soil.
