### NOVEMBER IN THE GARDEN

Now that the soil has started to warm up it is time to start planting all those warm weather plants; summer vegetables and annuals as well as citrus trees and perennials. Some crops such as celery, sweet corn and beans require regular deep watering and are not recommended if a good supply is not available.

I am trying a variety of tomatoes recommended by Peter Cundall called Moneymaker; a staking variety of medium size with a good flavour. Peter suggests planting the seedlings a metre apart to allow for maximum development and good air movement. Potatoes that are well up by now require large amounts of water and onions do not need to dry out too much. Don't forget to thin the carrots and parsnips; a tedious job but essential to good sized roots.

I have been spreading mulch around the fruit trees to conserve water and suppress weed growth to allow for more time in the summer to devote to watering and keeping plants well staked and tied.

Don't get too concerned at the spring flowering bulbs looking untidy as it won't be long before the tops are completely brown and those that are ready for storage can be safely lifted.

In the meantime enjoy the spring flowers. Happy Gardening Geoff May
