On Wednesday evening the 27th August, 2014 100 members and guests sat down to a 2 course meal in the Preston Shire Hall. The occasion, our 80th Anniversary.

Preston Horticultural Society was formed on the 27th August 1934 in this same hall, and many years later became the Preston Garden Club Inc.

Our guests included Don and Jennifer Rickerby, President of the Secretary Royal Horticultural Society of Victoria, along with other members of the RHSV. representatives from Broadmeadows, Ivanhoe. Mill Park, Doncaster and Williamstown Garden Clubs, and Pat Insal & Noreen Donovan from the Australian Horticultural Judges Association.

Guests were entertained with live background music and snippets of events in minutes throughout the earlier years, and the Secretary read out the inaugural minutes from a rather fragile minute book. Candles on our birthday cake were blown out by Life Member Hazel McGlone, whose father was one of the founding members of the club. Hazel, our longest serving member started exhibiting in the children's section at our shows as a child and has been involved with the club for its entire eighty years. So, it was very appropriate that she also cut the cake.

Two main awards were presented on the night, the first being Life Membership to Norma Thomas for more than twenty year's service to the club, several of them on committee and all of those years in charge of catering at all meetings and functions. The second surprise of the night was presented by Don Rickerby, the Gold John Pascoe Medal Fawkner to Robert Strugnell. Robert is a Life Member, had been President for twenty years straight and is now Vice President of the club and is the newsletter editor. Robert has contributed many years to horticulture both professionally and in encouraging community horticulture.

All present received a commemorative Preston Garden Club 80th Anniversary wine glass as a memento of this milestone in the club's history.

In 1996 Norma was elected to committee, a position, which she held until 2011. During this fifteen year term on committee, Norma took on the role as catering coordinator and oversaw all of our catering needs. She took her role very seriously, even taking a food handlers course with The City of Darebin's health department to ensure that she was up to date with safe food handling practises.

Norma was awarded Life Membership at our 80th birthday celebrations, the highest award that Preston Garden Club can give to a member. Congratulations.

Robert Strugnell's family joined Preston Garden Club in 1958. Robert was only three years old but soon began to enjoy exhibiting in the Children's Section at all of our shows. Robert took out full membership at the age of sixteen, attending some meetings and assisting at shows, whilst completing his apprenticeship in horticulture with the City of Melbourne. As a result Robert has always maintained a keen interest Melbourne's particularly in the Fitzroy Gardens, actually living in the gardener's cottage at the nursery for some years (no, not Cook's Cottage, across the path; the Cooks were his neighbours). It is not recorded when Robert joined committee, but he was elected Vice President in 1975, and President in 1984 – a position he held for twenty-three years straight. Robert is currently Vice President again. Robert also served on the Council of the RHSV in 1985 & 1986.

Robert has served on all subcommittees of the club and had most success at showing us how to win a number of displays at major events over the years, at the Royal Melbourne Show, Garden Week in the Hanging Basket city, Competitions and others. As he used to design and supervise the arrangements of the displays in a number of city gardens, particularly the floral beds in the Fitzroy Gardens, he gave us the extra edge that we needed to be at the top.

Robert had his own nursery at Kinglake (completely destroyed by fire on Black Saturday) and used to supply many plants for our trading table, especially at shows and festival days.

A Life Member since 1991, Robert was presented with The Gold John Pascoe Fawkner Medal, for Distinguished Service to Horticulture by Mr. Don Rickerby, President of the RHSV at our 80th birthday celebrations. This is the highest award that the RHSV can award to an affiliate member.

An award well deserved.

SAD NEWS

At our September meeting we paid our respects with a minutes silence to Marie Bentley, who passed away in September. Marie and her sister Joan joined our club in 1987 were popular and well and respected members. We remember Joan's beautiful floral art and Marie tantalising our taste buds with her tempting exhibits on the show bench; they were usually the ones with the blue ribbon draped around them.



It is with sadness too, to learn that former member and gentleman of the horticultural world, **Frank Turton** passed away on 3rd
October 2014.

Frank, the quiet one, and his lovely wife, Eunice (a real character) once told me that they were 'Boat People', 'Ten Pound POMS', who migrated from a little village in England behind Sherwood Forest, with their two girls, Mary and Susan, to Thomastown, Australia for a better life in the 1960's

Both Frank and Eunice loved dahlias and quickly joined the National Dahlia Society of Victoria after their arrival. Both were very much involved in the society, with Frank serving as president at one stage. Frank and Eunice joined Preston Garden Club in 1981 but resigned when they went to live in Dromana in 1993. Frank had since moved to Epping, joined Mill Park Garden Club and still visited our shows; they were everybody's friend and always put on a sensational display of dahlias at our autumn shows. They specialised in blooms the size of dinner plates as well as pompoms, and would fill the whole side of the wall in the City Hall and then some around the corner with exhibits.

At our 50th Anniversary show Frank cleaned the pool out by winning every award possible (21 from memory) and you would have seen a photo of him being awarded a clock, 'The City of Preston Trophy', by the mayor, Alan Hogan at our 80th celebrations.

Frank had just celebrated his 86th birthday and had celebrated even harder eight weeks previously on becoming a great grandfather. Eunice died in 2008.



We have just been informed that **May Morton** passed away on 10th October 2014. May joined Preston Garden Club in 1996 and has always been a regular attendee at our meetings, except for the really cold nights, despite the fact that she would have turned 90 in January. May, with her silver white hair always sat towards the front of the hall, where she could hear the speaker and ask questions. May had a strong sense of duty and fairness, and helping out, but did not like being in the limelight. At show-time, you would usually find May out back in the kitchen standing at the sink doing the dishes for hours on end.

May was really looking forward to our 80th birthday; was one of the first to reply to the invitation, and rang closer to the event to make sure that we had her on the guest list. Although tired, as she left the hall, May told us how much she enjoyed our 80th birthday. A few days later she was admitted to Austin Hospital, where she was diagnosed with leukaemia.
