## JULY IN THE WINTER GARDEN

Although some days of late have been a bit bleak to spend in the garden other days have been ideal to have a good 'tidy up' and a replanting of perennial plants. Most perennial plants thrive if they are carefully broken up and given a new spot in the garden. Even lavender is improved by finding a new place to perfume the Spring borders. I have recently lifted my rhubarb (1 plant) to a different part of the garden after over 10 years in a fairly open position. The new spot gets a lot more shade as I am hoping to avoid a lot of sunburn that really stresses the plants on a 40 degree day.

Asparagus is another perennial that doesn't mind a little shade in the summer. I have only had asparagus in 3 different positions in nearly 50 years, although for the 10 to 15 years in one spot the plants tend to creep into neighbouring beds.

It is still a good time to plant peas and broad beans especially if the Spring weather is at all normal this year. Towards the end of the month early potatoes can be planted in a sheltered spot and onion seedlings can also be transplanted. I plant the white 'salad' onions first followed by the red variety in September and lastly the keepers in October.

Don't forget to keep on top of the weeding as it is better to remove them before they set seed later on.
