MAKE YOUR OWN ROSE <u>FUNGICIDE</u>

Mix 2 teaspoonfuls bicarbonate of soda, half a teaspoonful of sunflower oil and a drop of dishwash liquid (fully biodegradable of course!) into one litre of water. Spray roses, wetting both sides of foliage. Controls black spot and mildew. Repeat weekly or after heavy rain or irrigation.

Remember that whatever you use, spraying requires thought, care and good timing. Pyrethrum is sold as a 'botanical' pesticide, a natural plant product, but it still affects a pest's nervous system. It may be organic, but it's also toxic and so should be treated with caution.

Personal protective clothing boots, gloves, goggles, longsleeved shirts and trousers still have an important role in 21st century organic gardening.
