Angelo is presenter, trainer and writer in the areas of sustainable gardening and permaculture. He has previously worked as a horticulturist in the garden nursery industry for a decade, writes for Good Organic Gardening Australia magazine, has a demonstration food forest garden in Melbourne's inner suburbs, and runs the educational website Deep Green Permaculture https://deepgreenpermaculture.com

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Here's the description of the garden tour:

In this garden tour of Angelo's multisensory garden, you'll see a wide range of edible and ornamental trees, shrubs, vines and groundcovers all working in harmony together to create an immersive garden.

Learn about how this garden is designed to appeal to all senses, not just our sense of taste. It's designed as a food forest garden, with over 30 fruit trees, dozens kinds of berries, and loads of medicinal herbs, but there also are many ornamentals that provide colour and fragrance throughout the season, and provide for pollinators. Everything from the garden is recycled onsite using a range of soil-building techniques. There's also an extensive collection of plants in pots, water plants, hydroponics, and many examples of vertical gardening to pack in as plants as possible. many Participants welcome are to cuttings and spare plants (please bring plastic bags to take them home in), and there will be question time throughout and at the end of the session.

JAM & COCONUT CAKE



Ingredients:

175g / 6¹/₂oz Self raising flour, If using plain or all purpose flour add extra 1¹/₂tsp baking powder.
120g / 4¹/₂oz Granulated sugar.
175g / 6¹/₂oz Vegetable or Sunflower oil.
4 Large eggs.
30g / 1oz Desiccated coconut.
1tsp Baking powder.
1tsp Vanilla extract.
¹/₄tsp Salt.
Jam and extra Coconut for topping.

Method:

First grease and flour a 2lb / 900g loaf tin, see video for dimensions. Preheat your oven to 170°C / 340°F / Gas mark 4

To a large bowl add the eggs, vanilla, coconut, sugar, salt, and oil and whisk for 1 minute.

Add in the flour and baking powder, and whisk it in until the batter is smooth.

Carefully pour the batter into the prepared loaf tin.

Place the tin in the middle of the oven and set the timer for 50 minutes.

After the 50 minutes check the cake is done by inserting a cocktail stick into the centre of the cake, if it comes out clean the cake is done, if not give it a further 5 minutes.

Place the tin on a wire rack for 10 minutes before removing it from the tin.

Turn out the cake from the tin, cover the top with a jam of your choice and sprinkle with more coconut.

The cake can be served hot or cold with custard.
